



Residents selected for regional healthcare scholarship

The Grimshaw Regional Healthcare Attraction and Retention Committee (GRHARC) is pleased to announce the 2024 GRHARC Healthcare Scholarship Program recipients. The \$2000 scholarship provides support for six students entering a healthcare or medical-related program and encourages them to live and work in the region. "Thank you to all who applied for the scholarship and congratulations to the successful recipients," says Stacey Messner, GRHARC Chairperson. "It is heartwarming to see so many people in our region pursuing careers in healthcare and we commend you all for your eagerness to contribute to healthy communities in the north - we wish we could support you all." A total of 13 applications were received in a widerange of healthcare professions. Application requirements included proof of residency in either the Town of Grimshaw, MD of Peace No. 135, Village of Berwyn or the County of Northern Lights, proof of acceptance into a health or medical-related program and a 500-700 word essay that includes information on their commitment to working in a rural northern setting. Funding for the three-year scholarship program is provided by the Town of Grimshaw, MD of Peace No. 135, Village of Berwyn, and the County of Northern Lights. "Please join us in thanking our municipal partners for their generosity in this important three-year scholarship program and their support in the committee's overall work," says Messner. The GRHARC committee has been in existence for 15 years and works to attract and retain healthcare professionals and support them as they integrate into the community. The committee consists of elected officials from the Town of Grimshaw, County of Northern Lights, Municipal District of Peace 135, the Village of Berwyn, a CAO from each municipality, a local physician, a physician resource planner from AHS, two members at large, and a consultant from RhPAP (Rural Health Professionals Action Plan).


Movies in the Theatre - during Teachers' Convention we are showing movies in the theatre each afternoon at 1 pm.

Important Property Tax Assessment Information for Residents

WHAT IS AN ASSESSMENT?

Property Assessment is the process of calculating/assigning a dollar value to each property for the purpose of property taxation. Based on Legislation, this "dollar value" can be: Market Value or Regulated Value

WHAT IS ASSESSED?



ASSESSMENT STANDARDS

The MGA and Matters Relating to Assessment and Taxation Regulation (MRAT) define the method and standards that must be met when assessments are prepared.

A property assessment based on MARKET VALUE must:

- Be prepared using mass appraisal
- Be estimate of the value of the fee simple estate in the property, and
- Reflect typical market conditions for properties similar to that property

WHAT IS TAXATION?

Taxation is the process of applying a tax rate (mill rate) to a property's assessed value to determine the taxes payable by the owner of that property. Property taxes are the major revenue source of local governments.

WHAT IS A MILL RATE?

The mill rate (or tax rate) is the relationship between the total taxable assessed value and the tax levy.

THINGS TO KEEP IN MIND

Assessors DO NOT determine how much property tax ratepayers must pay to a Municipality.

The amount of municipal taxes needed to operate are determined by Council on an annual basis.

Property Assessment is simply a distribution mechanism to fairly and equitably distribute the tax burden amongst all properties.

Mass Appraisal allows the Assessor to accurately value a large number of properties in a short period of time.
