Property Owner & Renter Responsibilities: What You Need to Know

Whether you own or rent property in Grimshaw, there are a few important responsibilities to keep in mind to help keep our community safe, clean, and well-maintained.

Yard & Property Maintenance

- Trim trees and bushes back from sidewalks, alleys, and corners to ensure safe passage for pedestrians and vehicles.
- Keep grass and weeds trimmed—maximum 4 inches for occupied properties and 8 inches for unoccupied land.
- Watch for noxious weeds such as scentless chamomile, oxeye daisy, toadflax, and Canada thistle, and remove them as recommended.
- Take all grass clippings and leaves to the Transfer Station—do not leave them in alleys.
- If planting trees or shrubs, ensure they are on your property and not on Town boulevards, as these areas are used for snow storage.
- Mow the grass and weeds in the alley behind your property.

Yard Sales & Signage

- Make sure yard sale signs are not placed on private property without permission.
- Remove all signs immediately after your sale ends.

Vehicles & Parking

- Semi-trucks and school buses cannot be parked on public streets due to length and weight restrictions—they must be on private property.
- Unattached holiday trailers are not permitted on Town streets at any time.
- Off-highway vehicles—including quads, dirt bikes, snowmobiles, and golf carts—are not allowed to operate within Town limits, including drainage ditches and industrial areas.

Hiring a Contractor? Check for a Business License!

If you're hiring a contractor for renovations or services, make sure they have a valid business license with the Town. You can check the Town of Grimshaw website at www.grimshaw.ca for a list of over 200 registered businesses. If you have any questions, contact the Town office at 780-332-4626.

Do you need a Development Permit? Here's when to check:

Planning a home improvement or new project? Before you get started, make sure to check if you need a development permit. Here are some common situations where one is required:

- Expanding or altering a deck or steps even if it's just a bit bigger or a new shape.
- Installing a shed larger than 12 by 12 feet on your property.
- Running a business from home or selling services a home-based business license is also required.
- Adding a porch or a cover over an existing deck.

These are just a few examples—if you're planning any construction and aren't sure whether a permit is needed, give the Town office a call at 780 332-4626.

TOG is accepting invitations for Proposals for Yard Maintenance

In cases where a resident/property owner fails, neglects, or refuses to cut their grass, clean up their yard, etc., the Town of Grimshaw hires a contractor or individual to remedy the condition. The Town of Grimshaw is accepting proposals from contractors/individuals who are interested in providing this service when required by the Town throughout the spring and summer of 2025. Proposals must include an hourly rate that would apply for the 2025 season. The successful contractor or individual shall be required to provide their own equipment to carry out the work and must provide the Town of Grimshaw with a copy of their Liability Insurance Coverage with the Town added as an "Additional Named Insured" and a Worker's Compensation Certificate. Council Highlights - Feb 12 & 26 Meetings

PRSD Flag Raising Ceremony - Council reviewed an invitation from Peace River School Division (PRSD) to attend the Treaty 8 flag and Métis Flag raising ceremony on March 13, 2025, at PRSD Central Operations in Grimshaw. Mayor Wendy Wald and fellow Council members will attend the ceremony.

Harvest Moon Festival - Misty Velichka and Amanda Condrotte, Co-Chairs of the Harvest Moon Committee, provided an update to Council regarding plans for the 2025 Harvest Festival scheduled for September 13, 2025. They announced plans to expand the event to two days by introducing an outdoor family-friendly cinema on Friday night. They also mentioned the inclusion of a Lego Competition and are exploring the possibility of including midway rides on Friday and Saturday. The committee intends to submit a formal request for Council's consideration to approve the closure of Main Street (from the Krooked House to the Catholic Church) starting at 6:00 p.m. on Friday, September 12th, to facilitate the setup for earlier events.

Skate Sharpening Fee Increase - Council approved a recommendation from the Grimshaw Community Services Advisory Board to implement a flat fee for skate sharpening of \$10 per pair, effective September 1, 2025.

SongRise Music Conference - Council reviewed and approved a sponsorship request from Community Futures Peace Country in support of the SongRise Music Conference taking place in Grimshaw on October 3 and 4, 2025. The two-day event will be held at the Mile Zero Regional Multiplex, and a concert will be held for the public to attend at the theatre on Saturday night.

Northwestern Polytechnic Fairview Convocation - Council reviewed an invite to the Northwestern Polytechnic 2025 Convocation Ceremony at the Fairview Campus on March 8, 2025. Deputy Mayor Stacey Messner will attend on behalf of Council.
