Grimshaw Women's Institute Cemetery Flood Remediation Project

Why this Project

The Women's Institute Cemetery has served as resting place for the deceased loved ones of our community since it was built in 1942. Over the course of time, however, ground instabilities and movements within the earth's surface below at the west side of the cemetery have resulted in little craters and mounds, causing flooding issues after rainfall. In 2021, Council committed to setting money aside each year to address the issue, in order to ensure that the cemetery remains safe and usable, and continues to serve its purpose.

Phase 2 (Summer 2023)

Phase 1 (Summer 2022)

Purpose

The goal of the project is to address the recurring flooding issues at the Grimshaw Women's Institute Cemetery.

What is involved?

Remedying the flooding issues would include the following tasks: Mapping the location of all headstones

Removing all headstones

Undertaking the necessary siteworks

Returning headstones to their location

Landscaping

How Long will it Take to Complete this Project?

The western part of the cemetery will be partitioned into four sections, corresponding to the four phases of the project. Each phase will be completed during the Summer. Phase 1 was completed in 2022, Phase 2 was completed in 2023 and Phase 4 was completed in 2024. Phase 3 will begin around July 07, 2025.

Phase 4 (Summer 2024)

The Town of Grimshaw recognizes and deeply respects the importance of remembering, celebrating, and honoring loved ones laid to rest at the Grimshaw Women's Institute Cemetery. We are committed to maintaining a space that reflects that reverence — one that is clean, well-manicured, and safe for all who visit. Over time, silk flowers, ornaments and other decorations placed at gravesites can break down or weather, creating safety concerns and challenges for our maintenance contractor and others navigating the grounds. To help us keep the cemetery safe and accessible, we kindly ask families to visit the cemetery and assist by removing any items that interfere with the grass cutting and regular upkeep. Please note that flowers and decorations are welcome to remain on the cement pad near the grave markers, where they do not interfere with any of our regular maintenance. We sincerely thank you for your understanding and cooperation in helping us care for this special place.


