DID YOU REGISTER TO VOTE?

Did you know that in order to vote in the Town of Grimshaw's upcoming municipal election, you must be listed on the Permanent Electors Register? Be sure to register as soon as possible at voterlink.ab.ca where you can also confirm your registration, or update your address or name if needed. If you are not registered in advance, you will need to complete a registration form at the voting station before receiving a ballot, which will also mean providing additional ID/documentation or someone to vouch for you. Registering online is easy and will save you time on Election Day.

WHAT'S HAPPENING AT THE LIBRARY?

BUSINESS HOURS return back to Main Branch being open Monday-Saturday 10-4:30pm. The library will CLOSED all day Tuesday, September 30 for Truth and Reconciliation Day. Thursday hours will extend to 7 pm in October, on a trial basis.

CHARACTER SPOTLIGHT Craft Kits are available every Saturday at the library. Just come and pick up your free kit, and then watch our instructional video on our Facebook page or YouTube channel. The characters for September are from the Life in the Wild books by Nicholas Oldland. You could make a bear, a moose, or a beaver, or maybe all three! All materials supplied.

LITTLE LEARNERS for children aged three and under, and their caregivers, is a 45-minute program held every Friday at 10:30 am, featuring stories and songs with Miss Danielle. Registration not required. Each family will receive a board book to take home, courtesy of Grimshaw Berwyn & District Community Adult Learning. The first session in September will be Friday, Sept. 19

BOOK BUDDIES are back! This is a weekly program of stories and crafts for children aged 3-5 and their caregivers, taking place on Mondays at 10:15. Families sign up for sessions, and registration is necessary. The cost is \$10 per family per session. Please come into the library to sign up, or give us a call. This program begins on Monday, September 15.

AFTER SCHOOL ACTIVITIES in the atrium (just outside the library doors) on Wednesdays 3:30-4:15 for all school-aged kids, starting October 1. A new craft or activity every week, free of charge thanks to sponsorship from the Grimshaw Community Services (FCSS). No need to register, just show up!

CHESS CLUB on Thursdays from 3:30-4:15. Students in grades 4 and up are encouraged to drop in and practice their strategy. Boards and rule books provided. The first session will be Thursday, Sept. 11

HOME ROUTES concerts return to Grimshaw, with the first one on Wednesday, October 1. Alberta artist Ashley Ghostkeeper will be here to perform. "Ghostkeeper is a proud Métis-Cree artist from Alberta whose heartfelt song writing and powerful voice have earned her growing recognition in Canada's country and Indigenous music scenes. Tickets are \$25, can be purchased ahead of time at the library, or at the door, and all funds go directly to the artist. Doors open at 6:30 pm, and the music starts at 7 pm.
