



Four Local Students Awarded Regional Healthcare Scholarships

The Grimshaw Regional Healthcare Attraction and Retention Committee (GRHARC) is proud to announce the recipients of the 2026 GRHARC Healthcare Scholarship Program.

This annual scholarship, valued at \$3,000 per recipient, provides financial support to four students pursuing healthcare or medical-related studies, with the goal of encouraging them to live and work in the region.

This year, 13 applications were received from students in various healthcare fields. To be eligible, applicants had to demonstrate residency in the Town of Grimshaw, MD of Peace No. 135, Village of Berwyn, or County of Northern Lights, provide proof of acceptance into a healthcare or medical program, and submit a 500-700 word essay outlining their commitment to serving in rural northern communities.

Funding for this scholarship initiative is generously provided by the Town of Grimshaw, Municipal District of Peace 135, Village of Berwyn and County of Northern Lights.

“We know these scholarships are truly appreciated, especially as the cost of attending school and living away from home continues to rise. That’s why the committee chose to increase the scholarship amount this year, to recognize those rising costs and to better support students as they pursue their education,” said Messner.

For the past 16 years, GRHARC has worked to attract and retain healthcare professionals, ensuring they feel welcomed and supported as they establish their careers in the region. The committee includes elected officials from participating municipalities, CAOs, a local physician, an AHS physician resource planner, three community representatives, and a consultant from RhPAP (Rural Health Professions Action Plan).



Important Property Tax Assessment Information for Residents

WHAT IS AN ASSESSMENT?

Property Assessment is the process of calculating/assigning a dollar value to each property for the purpose of property taxation. Based on Legislation, this “dollar value” can be: Market Value or Regulated Value

WHAT IS ASSESSED?



ASSESSMENT STANDARDS

The MGA and Matters Relating to Assessment and Taxation Regulation (MRAT) define the method and standards that must be met when assessments are prepared.

A property assessment based on MARKET VALUE must:

- Be prepared using mass appraisal
- Be estimate of the value of the fee simple estate in the property, and
- Reflect typical market conditions for properties similar to that property

WHAT IS TAXATION?

Taxation is the process of applying a tax rate (mill rate) to a property's assessed value to determine the taxes payable by the owner of that property. Property taxes are the major revenue source of local governments.

WHAT IS A MILL RATE?

The mill rate (or tax rate) is the relationship between the total taxable assessed value and the tax levy.

$$\frac{\text{Municipal Budget}}{\text{Taxable Assessment}} = \text{MILL RATE}$$

THINGS TO KEEP IN MIND

Assessors DO NOT determine how much property tax ratepayers must pay to a Municipality.

The amount of municipal taxes needed to operate are determined by Council on an annual basis.

Property Assessment is simply a distribution mechanism to fairly and equitably distribute the tax burden amongst all properties.

Mass Appraisal allows the Assessor to accurately value a large number of properties in a short period of time.
